Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to:
(general competences)

- demonstrate a good grasp of general and programme-specific scientific and professional aspects of the discipline,
- autonomously accumulate and apply knowledge and knowledge resources and sources,
- critically interpret scientific and technical literature,
- observe, analyse, synthesise and critically evaluate,
- undertake self-criticism and supervise their own professional development,
- work individually and as part of a team,

- plan, organise and implement research in the field of psychology (quantitative, qualitative, action research),
- monitor the development of the psychological profession.

Assessment and completion

Students' knowledge is assessed by means of practical exercises and seminar papers, and also via products, projects, performances, services, etc. and by examinations. Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5-1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

In order to progress to the second year, students must have completed all course units prescribed by the study programme for compulsory subjects in the first year, for a total of at least 49 credits. In order to enrol in the third year, students must have completed all first-year course units (60 credits) and course units prescribed by the study programme for second-year subjects totalling at least 50 credits.

Transitions

Second-cycle master's study programmes (SQF level 8)

Condition for obtaining certificate

In order to complete the programme, students must pass all examinations and complete all course units in all subjects of the curriculum, complete recognised practical training, and write and present a bachelor's seminar paper. In this way students complete all 180 credits from the study programme.
