Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to: (general competences)

- undertake critical reflection and work autonomously,

- demonstrate knowledge of the fundamental characteristics of contemporary Slovene,
- demonstrate knowledge of the historical development of the Slovene language,
- demonstrate knowledge of regional and other specific aspects of the Slovene language,
- define and demonstrate understanding of various factors that can modify language,
- deal with language of a specific phenomenon from the point of view of cognitive sciences, the humanities and social sciences,
- apply the most important modern linguistic research methodologies,

- demonstrate knowledge of the historical development of Slovene literature,
- define and demonstrate understanding of various factors of influence on Slovene literature,
- demonstrate knowledge of the basics of literary studies,
- demonstrate knowledge of the most important modern research methodologies in the field of literary science,
- demonstrate knowledge of Slovene and foreign literary works,
- demonstrate knowledge of scholarly literature in the field of Slovene literature and literary science,
- demonstrate knowledge of the development of schools, streams and currents of literary history, theory and criticism in Slovenia and elsewhere,
- critically consider and assess a literary work and provide an interpretation of it,
- demonstrate basic computer skills,
- demonstrate knowledge of foreign languages for the needs of everyday, technical and business communication,
- demonstrate knowledge of the history of the Slovene nation and neighbouring nations,
- demonstrate knowledge of the foundations of other humanities and social science disciplines (at the level of free elective subjects),
- demonstrate knowledge of contents in business, technical, natural science and other disciplines.

Assessment and completion

Students' knowledge is assessed through practical classes and seminar papers; it may also be assessed through products, projects, public appearances, services, etc., and by examinations. Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5-1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

Students may progress to the next year if by the end of the academic year they have completed all requirements defined by the study programme for progression to the next year.

In order to complete the programme, students must complete all course units prescribed by the study programme.
