Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to:
(general competences)

- demonstrate proficiency in the research methods of linguistics and literary sciences,
- combine the methodology of Slovene studies research with the methodology of another field in order to obtain new research results,
- critically evaluate own research achievements and those of others,
- appropriately incorporate and combine facts and knowledge into new quality,
- develop communication skills for tolerant and appropriate specialised discourse,
- develop the ability to participate constructively in teamwork and participate in work involving different teams,
- develop the principle of autonomy and interconnection in own professional work,
- apply knowledge in practice,

(subject-specific competences)

- demonstrate knowledge and understanding of the history and development of Slovene language and literature,
- demonstrate knowledge of the language's remarkable dialectal segmentation and the influence of this on the standard language,
- compare synchronic linguistic and literary phenomena from the point of view of historical linguistic and literary development,
- demonstrate proficiency in Slovene orthography and orthoepy,
- demonstrate mastery and understanding of morphemic and morphosyntactic categories and knowledge of the text syntax of the language,
- demonstrate understanding of word-formational, interlexemic and phraseological relationships in Slovene from the point of view of new theoretical approaches in linguistics,
- autonomously keep abreast of current linguistic and literary phenomena and place them in the context of already acquired knowledge,
- demonstrate knowledge of older and modern currents in Slovene literature at the turn of the millennium,
- publicly engage in promoting a culture of writing and reading,
- demonstrate analytical and synthetic thinking,
- develop a sense for aesthetic and ethical values in the discipline.

Assessment and completion

Students' knowledge is assessed by means of practical exercises and seminar papers, and also via products, projects, performances, services, etc. and by examinations. Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5-1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

In the first cycle of the two-subject academic higher education programme Slovene Language and Literature, in order to progress to the second year students must have completed 24 credits in the Slovene Language and Literature programme (of the total 60 credits prescribed for the first year of the two-subject programme), namely all the first-year course units prescribed by the study programme Slovene Language and Literature from compulsory modules, amounting to 24 credits. In order to progress to the third year, students must have completed all first-year course units in the Slovene Language and Literature programme (30 credits) and 24 credits (of the total 60 credits prescribed for the second year of the two-subject programme), namely all the second-year course units prescribed by the study programme Slovene Language and Literature from compulsory modules, amounting to 24 credits.

Transitions

Second-cycle master's study programmes (SQF level 8)

Condition for obtaining certificate

In order to complete a two-subject study programme, students must complete all course units prescribed by the programme in both parts of the two-subject study programme for a total of at least 180 credits (90 credits in each part of the two-subject study programme).
