Admission requirements

• A completed first-cycle programme in philosophy; or

• a completed first-cycle study programme in another field, if prior to enrolment the candidate has completed course units essential for further study consisting of 5–30 credits and a corresponding number of credits in the other part of the two-subject study programme; or

• a completed professional higher education programme, adopted before 11 June 2004, in a relevant field (philosophy); or

• a completed professional higher education programme adopted before 11 June 2004 in another field, if prior to enrolment the candidate has completed course units essential for further study consisting of 5–30 credits and a corresponding number of credits in the other part of the two-subject study programme; or

• a completed academic higher education programme in a relevant field (philosophy), adopted before 11 June 2004; as a rule, 30 credits and a corresponding number in the other part of the two-subject programme are recognised for these candidates; or

• a completed professional higher education programme in a relevant field (philosophy), adopted before 11 June 2004 (candidates who have also completed a specialisation programme); as a rule, 30 credits and a corresponding number in the other part of the two-subject programme are recognised for these candidates.

Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to: (general competences)

- critically analyse in depth, synthesise and anticipate solutions and consequences,
- demonstrate mastery of research methods, procedures and processes,

- articulate the problems of everyday life as philosophical problems and find appropriate solutions to them.

Assessment and completion

Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5–1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

In order to progress to the next year of a second-cycle two-subject programme with teacher training component, students must have completed course units totalling 90% of the credits prescribed by the curriculum for the individual year (i.e. 54 out of 60 credits).

Transitions

Third-cycle doctoral study programmes (SQF level 10)

Condition for obtaining certificate

In order to complete a two-subject study programme, students must complete all course units in both

parts of the two-subject study programme, for a total of at least 120 credits (60 credits in each part of the two-subject study programme).
