Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to: (general competences)

- analyse in depth and critically, synthesise and anticipate solutions and consequences,
- demonstrate mastery of research methods, procedures and processes,

- engage with the problems of everyday life: reflection, problematisation, the search for assumptions and implications, etc.
- articulate the problems of everyday life as philosophical problems and find appropriate solutions to them.

Assessment and completion

Examination performance is graded as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5–1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

Progression

In order to progress to the second year, students must complete at least 44 credits from first-year course units.

Condition for obtaining certificate

In order to complete the programme, students must complete all course units prescribed by the programme, for a total of at least 120 credits.
