Candidates from indents 2-5 complete up to 60 credits' worth of additional course units, which are determined individually from a range of first-cycle subjects.

Learning outcomes

The qualification holder will be able to:

- demonstrate proficiency in the principles of educational research and their application in improving learning and teaching,
- encourage active, independent and cooperative learning among students,
- appropriately use various methods to monitor, verify and assess student progress,
- communicate effectively and develop positive relationships with students,
- identify students with special needs, adapt work to their abilities and cooperate with the appropriate experts,
- encourage positive values, views and behaviour,
- plan, monitor, evaluate and balance own professional development.

Assessment and completion

Examination performance is scored as follows: 10 (excellent); 9 (very good: above-average knowledge but with some mistakes); 8 (very good: solid results); 7 (good); 6 (adequate: knowledge satisfies minimum criteria); 5–1 (inadequate). In order to pass an examination, a candidate must achieve a grade between adequate (6) and excellent (10).

In order to progress to a higher year, students must complete course units totalling 90% of the credits prescribed by the curriculum for the individual year (i.e. 54 out of 60 credits).

In order to complete the study programme, students must complete all requirements laid down by the study programme and the syllabuses of individual subjects, totalling 60 credits.
